The College of Education and Human Development is pleased to announce a new Undergraduate Research Grant. Consistent with the College's strategic aims and Action 2015 initiatives, the objective of this research grant is to facilitate undergraduate research across the four departments. Expected learning outcomes include increased proficiency in the research process (e.g., developing research questions, engagement in research projects) and in the dissemination of research findings. Thus, students will work with a faculty mentor on a new or existing project, thereby gaining valuable research experience and understanding and present their work at a local, state, or national setting (e.g., Student Research Week, state or national conferences, or other publications).

Undergraduates will be awarded a \$500 stipend to assist with tuition, books, and other supplies needed to carry out the research. In addition, the faculty mentor will receive \$500 in a research and development account to help cover the costs associated with the research project.

To apply for the grant, submit the completed form (see attached) prior to the semester in which the research is set to begin. Grant monies will be distributed as they are available.
